

Peterson-Milbank Program for Sustainable Health Care Costs

Executive Order and/or Statute

Governor Murphy established an Office of Health Care Affordability and Transparency (OHCAT) in 2020 to develop and coordinate efforts to address health care costs. In January 2021, the Governor issued an <u>Executive</u> <u>Order</u> creating the Health Care Affordability Interagency Working Group, to be chaired by the Director of OHCAT and a Health Care Affordability Advisory Group. The group was charged with setting up the infrastructure to support the state's development and implementation of health care cost growth benchmarks. In addition to OHCAT, the group is comprised of the Commissioners of the Departments of Banking and Insurance, Health, Human Services, Treasury and the Division of Consumer Affairs.

In <u>December 2021</u>, Governor Phil Murphy signed <u>Executive Order #277</u>, which launched the New Jersey Affordability, Responsibility, and Transparency (HART) Program. The governor also announced a stakeholder compact that unites New Jersey insurers, health care providers, and health care advocates in support of the new program and the goal of working together to provide more affordable health care for all New Jerseyans.
